



Strategies for Providing Adolescent-Friendly Care



Facilitate access to sexual health services



Ensure privacy and confidentiality in care



Create a warm and welcoming environment



Foster safety and comfort around sexual health



Address the whole person




Engage and uplift youth voices

Strategy: Foster safety and comfort around sexual health



Programs can...



- Employ health educators for individualized counseling
- Allow a support person to be present



Providers can...

- Avoid assumptions
- Use anatomically correct and gender-neutral terminology
- Acknowledge social and cultural considerations
- Use open-ended questions

Case Example: La Clinica LARC Doula



A LARC Doula is a person who is trained to provide emotional, physical, and informational support before, during and after a LARC procedure.





Trauma-informed Language for IUD Procedures

Adapted from Arin Kramer, MS, RN, FNP-BC

Instead of...

I'm going to do the exam now

Open/spread your legs

Everything looks good/beautiful

Try saying...

Before we start, I want you to be aware that you are in control of the pace. If you ever want me to slow down or stop, let me know.

Let your knees fall to the sides or towards the walls

Everything looks normal and healthy

Why?

Model consent and build autonomy

Be mindful of triggering language

Remove the focus on image



Engage and uplift youth voices

- Light touch: Feedback through surveys, suggestion jars, listening sessions
- Digging deeper: Youth advisory councils or peer education programs

Case Example: Minneapolis School-Based Clinics' Teen Empowerment Council



- Provide feedback through both light touch activities and deeper activities (e.g. "secret shopping")
- Led to tangible changes in clinic approach, such as creation of social media presence
